MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 30, 2017 6:30 P.M. SELECTMEN'S CHAMBERS, TOWN HALL 272 MAIN STREET, TOWNSEND, MA

I. PRELIMINARIES - VOTES MAY BE TAKEN:

- 1.1 CK called the meeting to order at 6:30P.M.
 Roll call vote taken showed 3 members present: Chairman, Cindy King (CK)
 Vice-Chairman, Gordon Clark (GC) and Clerk, Sue Lisio (SL).
- 1.2 Pledge of Allegiance
- 1.3 CK announced the meeting is being tape recorded and asked the audience if anyone else would be tape or video recording.
- 1.4 CK moved to add 4.10 to the agenda *as revised, for an application for permit.

II. APPOINTMENTS AND HEARINGS - VOTES MAY BE TAKEN:

2.1 6:35P.M. Maintenance Supervisor, Mark Mercurio, RE: Facilities Department Updates.

Mr. Mercurio introduced Brian Mayer to the Board; Mr. Mayer was recently hired to assist with the maintenance of buildings and ongoing projects. Mr. Mercurio gave the Board an update of the pending, completed, and future projects with the department. Mr. Mercurio updated the Board of the progress made to the grounds, further recommending the Board extend the current landscaping contract.

7:00P.M. Recycling Committee Member, Irene Condon, RE: Committee Updates. Mrs. Condon met with the Board and discussed the successful outcome of the textiles drive with over 5000 pounds of material. Ms. Condon announced the there'll be a forum on November 13th and asked the Board members to consider being involved with the project. The environmental forum will begin at 6:00P.M., discussion regarding implementing programs for waste reduction will be at topic

and encouraged the public to participate. Ms. Condon also announced the swap shop was operational at the recycling center.

Mrs. Condon also informed the Board the planning of the 2018 Earth Day has begun, it will be celebrated on April 21, 2017 noting the National Day is April 22, 2017. The theme for this year will be hoof and woof. The hazardous waste center at Devens will be open Wednesday November 1, 2017.

Mr. Kreidler informed the Board, the town received a grant of \$33,000 for Complete Streets, Tier 2 and have contracted with the planning agency to create the prioritized list to be submitted for funding.

Mr. Kreidler informed the Board the School Superintendent, Joan Landers would be retiring at the end of the school year.

Mr. Kreidler informed the Board that Deputy Chief Sartell would be starting next week and he did received his police certification.

Proclamation

WHEREAS, diabetes affects 29.1 million people -- 9.3% of the population in the United States, and is a serious disease for which there is no known cure and which is the seventh leading cause of death by disease in the United States; and

WHEREAS, approximately one quarter of the Americans who have diabetes, 8.1 million (27.8%) of people, do not know they have the disease and may experience damage to the heart, eyes, kidneys, and limbs without producing any symptoms; and

WHEREAS, another 86 million, or 1 in 3 American adults, has pre-diabetes, a condition which puts them at greater risk for developing Type 2 diabetes, and if current trends continue, 1 in 3 American adults will have diabetes by 2050; and

WHEREAS, Type 1 diabetes (T1D) is an autoimmune disease in which a person's pancreas stops producing insulin, a hormone that enables people to get energy from food. It occurs when the body's immune system attacks and destroys the insulin-producing cells in the pancreas, called beta cells. While its causes are not yet entirely understood, scientists believe that both genetic factors and environmental triggers are involved. Its onset has nothing to do with diet or lifestyle. There is no prevention for T1D, and – at present – no cure; and

WHEREAS, T1D strikes both children and adults at any age. It comes on suddenly, causes dependence on injected or pumped insulin for life, and carries the constant threat of devastating complications; and

WHEREAS, 1.25M Americans are living with T1D including about 200,000 youth (less than 20 years old) and over a million adults (20 years old and older); 40,000 people are diagnosed each year in the U.S.; 5 million people in the U.S. are expected to have T1D by 2050, including nearly 600,000 youth; between 2001 and 2009 there was a 21% increase in the prevalence of T1D in people under age 20; \$14B T1D-associated annual healthcare costs in the U.S; and

WHEREAS, diabetes has many faces, affecting everyone, young and old alike - Caucasians, African Americans, Latinos, Native Americans, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, with minority populations in the United States having an increased risk for developing the disease; and

WHEREAS, an increase in community awareness of risk factors and symptoms related to diabetes can improve the likelihood that people with diabetes will get the attention they need before suffering the devastating complications of the disease;

NOW, THEREFORE, *The Board of Selectmen* do hereby proclaim November 2017, as DIABETES AWARENESS MONTH in the Town of Townsend, and encourage all citizens to help fight this disease and its deadly complications, including heart and kidney disease, stroke, blindness, and amputation, by increasing awareness of the risk factors for diabetes, and by providing support to those suffering from diabetes.

I. PRELIMINARIES - VOTES MAY BE TAKEN:

- 1.1 The meeting was called to order at 7:39P.M.
 Roll call vote taken showed 3 members present: Chairman. Gordon Clark (GC), Vice-Chairman, Cindy King (CK) and Clerk, Sue Lisio (SL)
- 1.2 Pledge of Allegiance
- 1.3 The Chairman announced the meeting was being tape recorded.
- 1.4 Chairman's Additions or Deletions.
 - 3.7 Award bid to Fox Painting, Inc

GC deleted the section under Selectmen Clark updates, Accomplishment and Goals

CK seconded. Unanimous vote.

- 2.2 SL moved to appoint Janet A. Johnson and Shirley Coit as Representatives to the North Middlesex Emergency Planning Committee effective October 17, 2017 to June 30, 2018. CK seconded. Unanimous vote.
- 2.3 The Board engaged in discussion to appoint a Selectmen's Rep to the Capital Planning Committee: additional conversation regarding other appointments and involvement on different committees and duties of the Capital Planning Committee ensued.

CK offered to be the appointee to the Committee.

SL move to approve the appointment of Cindy King as the Selectmen's Representative to the Capital Planning Committee for a term effective October 17, 2017 to June 30, 2018. GC seconded. Unanimous vote.

III. MEETING BUSINESS - VOTES MAY BE TAKEN:

- 3.7 Mr. Kreidler outlined the procurement process in regards to the exterior painting project. The Board reviewed the bid prices submitted (see attached)

V: EXECUTIVE SESSION - VOTES MAY BE TAKEN:

SL moved to enter executive session pursuant to GL c. 30A, s. 21(a)(3) to discuss strategy with respect to collective bargaining or litigation if an open meeting may have a detrimental effect on the bargaining position or litigating position and the chair so declares, re: pending litigation- Merrill and pursuant to GL c. 30A, s. 21(a)(2) to discuss strategy or to conduct negotiations with non-union personnel with respects to the Town Administrator and to reconvene in open session. CK seconded. Roll call vote GC (YES), CK (YES), and SL (YES).

GC explained the Board that he asked this item to be on agenda, relaying that in accordance to his contract, that JK would be entitled to the same 22% base salary increase that the Fire Chief received. JK stated for the record he was not looking to receive a raise beyond the 2.5% that he and all other employees received for this fiscal year.

Further discussion ensued regarding the work that had been undertaken to stabilize the organization and with only 1.5 years left on the contract not sure if that work will be able to continue. SL sought clarification regarding the number of years an employment contract can be authorized for the Town Administrator. JK advised that under MGL c. 41 section 108N a Town Administrator contract can be agreed to "for a period of time" versus for Police or Fire Chiefs which limit contracts to three years. JK referred to letter of Dee Moschos, the attorney who wrote the legislation. (see attached)

Mr. Kreidler relayed if a three year extension is agreed to, he would waive the wording for a raise to be line with the Fire Chief for both FY18 and FY19. SL voiced concern with negotiating so early. Kreidler reminded SL that she and a prior board began renegotiations with a prior Town Administrator close to a year and a half early as well. SL expressed concern about extending a contract for that amount of time. Both CK and GC agreed to the extension and thought it was warranted and appropriate to stabilize the upper management of the town.

CK moved to extend the Town Administrator's contract by 3 additional years in consideration of Kreidler waiving rights to receive a base salary increase equal to the base salary increase of the Fire Chief for FY18 and 19 that he would otherwise be entitled to receive. GC seconded. Roll call vote GC (YES), CK (YES) and SL (NO)

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The parties next discussed adjusting the automobile stipend. CK motion to adjust the automobile stipend to equal the Supervisory Union contract amount of \$500.00 per month but not take effect until July 1, 2019. GC seconded. Roll call vote GC (YES), CK (YES) and SL (NO)

CK moved to reconvene in open session at 9:30P.M. SL seconded. Roll call vote GC (YES) CK (YES) and SL (YES).

GC moved to recess for 5 minutes before calling to order.

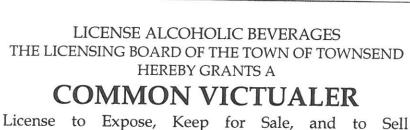
